



SATA League Covid -19 Guidelines

- SATA wants to ensure all players are able to play in a safe environment. Per our 2020 SATA Tennis Policies and Procedures, Captains have an obligation to treat all players with respect, civility and courtesy at all times and remain above the fray. Players also have a duty to respect players on the court and not expose any hazardous conditions to their opponents. With this in mind we are adding new Covid-19 Guidelines:

Covid-19 Guidelines to be followed **with a sense of urgency**:

1. **If you have Covid-19 symptoms, have tested positive or been exposed, you are not permitted to play and must inform your captain.**
2. Inform your captain of any teammates or opponents who you have come in contact with in the previous 14 days. Your captain will inform exposed players and/or the opposing captain.
3. Home captain should **inform the hosting facility** that a person later found to be Covid-19 positive was at the facility on 'the date'.
4. **Inform the Leagues Coordinator about the situation.**
5. If a player informs their captain the day of a league match that they have tested positive or have been exposed, the captain should try to find an alternate player; however, if the captain cannot find an alternate player prior to the match that line will be a default. This is the same as if a player calls out sick prior to a match.
6. Captains should inform the player that tested positive he or she cannot return to play until the 14-day isolation period.
7. Captains should also inform any players that have been exposed to self-isolate as recommended by the CDC.

The anonymity of the exposed player should be maintained as much as possible. Informing another team, a player on our team was at your facility on 'the date' has since tested positive for Covid" should be enough to get the preventative ball rolling.

You may disclose to the opposing captain the specific line the affected player played on. The opposing captain should be discreet with identifying information when informing their players about the possible exposure. This is an evolving situation. These guidelines may be updated as we move forward.
